Stephanie has also provided over a decade of strategic consulting on transportation issues to the public and private sectors following a distinguished career at the Conservation Law Foundation in Boston. She has been active in public policy issues affecting transportation, development and sustainability nationally and locally, serving on numerous boards and advisory bodies including chairing the Transportation Advisory Committee in her hometown of Newton.

Secretary Pollack received both a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering and a Bachelor of Science in Public Policy from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a Juris Doctorate from Harvard Law School.
